4. Read Matthew 25:14-30. How are responsibility, accountability, and privilege linked in this passage?

In what ways have you experienced this linkage in your own life?

5. Bevan explained that God is the one who set up the Ladder of Responsibility and designed the world to work this way. Read the following verses and discuss how God wants us to approach our responsibilities.

Proverbs 12:24

Proverbs 22:29

Matthew 23:11-12

Colossians 3:23-25
